THE MOTOR-VEHICLES INSURANCE (THIRD-PARTY RISKS) REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 1.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 21st day of May, 1941.

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

Pursuant to the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Motor-vehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Regulations 1939 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. As from the 31st day of May, 1941, Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following substituted:—

"REGULATION 5.—PREMIUMS.

- "(1) The annual premiums payable in respect of contracts of insurance under the said Act shall, for the license year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1941, and terminating on the 30th day of June, 1942, be as set out in column 3 of the Third Schedule hereto, and, for the license year commencing on the 1st day of July in 1942 and any subsequent year, be as set out in column 4 of the said Third Schedule, and the classes of motor-vehicle for the purpose of insurance premiums shall be those set out and described in column 2 of the said Third Schedule.
- "(2) When a contract of insurance in respect of any motor-vehicle is entered into for a period of less than the full license year the amount of the respective premium as prescribed in the Third Schedule hereto

shall be reduced in the case of the license year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1941, by one-thirteenth part and in the case of any subsequent licensing year by one-twelfth part of the amount of the premium prescribed in respect of that class of vehicle by column 3 or column 4 (as the case may be) of the said Schedule for every complete month by which the term of the contract is less than the full license year.

- "(3) For the purpose of this regulation and Regulation 8 hereof 'license year' means the complete term during which a license granted under section 10 of the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, is effective when granted at the earliest possible date."
- 4. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking all words following the word "equal", and substituting the words: "in the case of the license year commencing on the 1st day of June, 1941, to one-thirteenth part and in the case of any subsequent license year to one-twelfth part of the amount of the premium prescribed in respect of that class of vehicle by column 3 or column 4 (as the case may be) of the Third Schedule hereto for every complete month between the date of the happening of the event which led to the cancellation of the registration and the end of the term of the contract of insurance."
- 5. As from the 31st day of May, 1941, the Third Schedule to the principal regulations is revoked, and the following Schedule is substituted:—
