HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Transport Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Motor-Vehicles Insurance (Third-Party Risks) Regulations 1960, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Motor-Vehicles Insurance (Third-Party Risks) Regulations 1960* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1962.
- 2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Motor-Vehicles Insurance (Third-Party Risks) Regulations 1960, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "1st day of July 1961", and substituting the words "1st day of July 1962".
- 3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the First Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Motor-Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Regulations 1960, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule.
