THE MEAT LEVY REGULATIONS 1953

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of October

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL Pursuant to the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Meat Levy Regulations 1953.
- 2. The charges payable by way of levy on meat exported from New Zealand to which section 13 of the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22 applies shall not exceed,—
 - (a) In the case of lamb, mutton, pork, or veal, 3d. a carcass; and (b) In the case of beef, $l_{\frac{1}{2}}$ d. a quarter or 3d. a side.

 - 3. The following regulations are hereby revoked:
 - (a) The regulations made under the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22 on the 2nd day of March 1922 and published in the Gazette on the 11th day of that month at page 661:
 - (b) The regulations made under that Act on the 7th day of November 1923 and published in the Gazette on the 15th day of that month at page 2799.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.] These regulations prescribe the maximum levy that may be charged on exported meat for the purposes of the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22.
