



**THE MEDICAL LABORATORY TECHNOLOGISTS REGULATIONS
1989, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 12th day of March 1990

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 40 of the Medical Auxiliaries Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Laboratory Technologists Regulations 1989, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Medical Laboratory Technologists Regulations 1989* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1990.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 11, and substituting the following regulation:

“11. (1) The fee for each paper for each prescribed examination shall be \$97.00.

“(2) The fee for an application for registration as a medical laboratory technologist shall be \$73.00.

“(3) The fee for an annual licence issued to a registered medical laboratory technologist shall be \$73.00.

“(4) The fee for any alteration in, or addition to, an entry in the register, other than a change of address or a change of name on marriage or correction of an error for which the person registered is not responsible, shall be \$12.00.

“(5) The fee for restoration of a name to the register under section 21 of the Act shall be \$43.00.

“(6) The fee for inspection of the register shall be \$24.00.

“(7) The fee for a Certificate of Registration shall be \$24.00.”

3. Fees inclusive of goods and services tax—The fees fixed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1990, prescribe a new and increased scale of fees payable under the Medical Auxiliaries Act 1966.

The fees prescribed are inclusive of goods and services tax.
