**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 17th day of March 1953

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

**ORDER**

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Marketing Order 1942\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) The principal order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto (as substituted by clause 2 of the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 9), and substituting the following Schedule:—

(2) Clause 2 of the Meat Marketing Order No. 9 is hereby revoked.

3. Clause 8 of the principal order is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the word "seventeen", and substituting the word "thirteen".

4. In addition to the amounts for the time being authorized to be paid by the Department for edible offals in respect of the period from the 1st day of October 1951 to the 30th day of March 1952, there may be paid such amounts as the Department agrees, but so that the total amount so paid in respect of the said period does not exceed the amount authorized by the principal order to be paid by the Department for edible offals in respect of the period from the 31st day of March 1952 to the date of the coming into force of this order.
