## Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Marketing Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

#### ORDER

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Marketing Order 1942\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
- 2. (1) The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto (as enacted by clause 4 of the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule:—
