ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day
of July, 1944

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Marketing Order 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. (1) The principal Order is hereby amended by revoking the Schedule thereto (as enacted by clause 4 of the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule :—
