THE MEAT MARKETING ORDER 1942, AMENDMENT NO. 4

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 24th day of

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Meat Marketing Order 1942, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Marketing Order 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. Clause 10 of the principal Order is hereby amended as follows :—

- (a) By omitting from paragraph (a) thereof all words after the words " clause 7 hereof " :
- (b) By revoking paragraph (b) thereof.

3. The principal Order is hereby further amended by inserting, after clause 11, the following clause :—

" 11A. If, on the delivery of any meat purchased by the Department, the amount of the transport costs and other charges incurred by or on behalf of the owner is less than would in the opinion of the Department have been incurred in respect of the delivery of the meat free on board a ship for export at the usual port of shipment of the freezing-works at which the meat has been stored, there shall be payable to the Department by the freezing company by which the meat was delivered the difference between the amount of the normal costs and charges and the amount of the costs and charges actually incurred."
