ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 14th day of April 1969

PURSUANT to the Meat Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Meat Order 1969.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Meaning of "poultry"—Pigeons are hereby declared to be poultry for the purposes of the Meat Act 1964.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of declaring pigeons to be poultry for the purposes of the Meat Act 1964 is that Part IVA of that Act (inserted by section 12 of the Meat Amendment Act 1968), which relates to poultry-processing houses, will apply to premises used for the slaughter, processing, or canning of pigeons intended for sale for human consumption.
