- 1 **Title**  
This order is the Medicines (Deferral of Expiry of Part 7A) Order 2006.
- 2 **Commencement**  
This order comes into force 28 days after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

**3 Expiry of Part**

Section 96J(1) of the Medicines Act 1981 is amended by omitting “31 December 2006” and substituting “31 December 2008”.

**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order, which comes into force 28 days after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, defers the expiry of Part 7A of the Medicines Act 1981 to 31 December 2008. Part 7A imposes restrictions on xenotransplantation.
