



THE MAINTENANCE ORDERS (FACILITIES FOR ENFORCEMENT) AMENDING REGULATIONS 1944

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 22nd day of November, 1944

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Amending Regulations 1944, and shall be read together with and form part of the regulations made under the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921, on the 10th day of September, 1923, and published in the *Gazette* on the 13th day of the same month at page 2416 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

“ 5. The requisition referred to in section 5 of the said Act may be in the form numbered D.P. 23 as set forth in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.”

3. Form D.P. 23 in the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following form substituted therefor:—

“ REQUISITION TO A JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

“ *The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921*

“ To, one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.

“ And whereas a certified copy of the said order, together with the depositions of witnesses and a statement of the grounds on which the order might have been opposed, has been transmitted in the appropriate manner to the Minister of Justice :

“ Now, therefore, by direction of the Minister of Justice, acting in accordance with the provisions of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act, 1921, I do herewith transmit to you the said documents, and do hereby request you to issue a summons to the said, calling upon him to appear before a Magistrate to show cause why the said order should not be confirmed.
