THE MONEY ORDER REGULATIONS 1949. AMENDMENT NO. 2

PURSUANT to the Post and Telegraph Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Money Order Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of

January 1953.

2. (1) Regulation 24 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 1, is hereby further amended by omitting the words "of 1s. 6d. if sent at ordinary rates and 2s. 2d. if sent urgent", and substituting the words "of 1s. 9d. if sent at ordinary rates and 2s. 6d. if sent urgent".

(2) The Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 1, are

hereby revoked.

3. Regulation 25 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the scale of charges set out in that regulation the words "7s. 6d. per message", and substituting the words "6s. per message".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations increase the rates for telegraph money orders and reduce the rates for money orders transmitted by radio telegram at certain stations in the Cook Group.
