THE MONEY ORDER REGULATIONS 1949, AMENDMENT NO. 5

At the Government House at Wellington this 5th day of July 1967

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Money Order Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 10th day of July

1967.

2. Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the words "one penny", and substituting the words "one cent".

3. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 24 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the following

regulation:

"24. The commission on a money order payable in New Zealand shall be 10c for any amount not exceeding \$20 and an additional 5c for each additional \$20 or fraction thereof. For a telegraph order there shall be payable in addition a telegraph fee of 30c if sent at ordinary rates and 50c if sent urgent, plus 2c for each word included in any private message added to the official telegram. The remitter of a telegraph order must write the private message in the space provided on the requisition form and may prepay the cost of a telegraphic reply:

"Provided that money orders payable within or beyond New Zealand may be issued free of charge at the discretion of the Postmaster-General".

(2) Regulation 2 of the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 4, is hereby revoked.
