**THE MONEY ORDER REGULATIONS 1949,
AMENDMENT NO. 7**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 8th day of June 1971

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Post Office Act 1959, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Money Order Regulations 1949, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Money Order Regulations 1949* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Restrictions on amounts of money orders—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 13, and substituting the following regulation:

“13. (1) The Postmaster-General may prescribe from time to time by notice published in the *Gazette* the minimum amount for which a money order to be forwarded by post for payment in New Zealand may be issued.

“(2) The maximum amount for which a money order payable in New Zealand may be issued shall be \$200.

“(3) Notwithstanding subclause (2) of this regulation, the Postmaster-General may, in any particular case and under such circumstances as he deems expedient, extend or reduce the maximum amount.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Money Order Regulations 1949 by empowering the Postmaster-General to fix the minimum value for which an inland money order to be forwarded by post may be issued.
