HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL  
PURSUANT to the Dairy Industry Act 1952 and the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act 1934, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Milk Production and Supply Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Milk Production and Supply Regulations 1973\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Revocation of Part II of principal regulations**—(1) Part II of the principal regulations is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations abolish the provisions of the Milk Production and Supply Regulations 1973 relating to the registration of farm dairies, and the prohibition of the use of unregistered farm dairies for the production of milk for human consumption.
