PURSUANT to section 3 of the Motor-spirits (Regulation of Prices) Act, 1933, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-spirits Prices District Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 4.

2. These regulations shall be read with and form part of the Motor-spirits Prices District Regulations 1941* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.

4. Regulations 4 and 5 of the principal regulations, as amended by the Motor-spirits Prices District Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2, and by the Motor-spirits Prices District Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 3, are further amended by increasing by 1d. per gallon all the prices set out in the respective price schedules contained in the several regulations referred to in the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Schedules to the principal regulations as the same have heretofore been amended, and the said respective price schedules are further amended accordingly.
