**THE MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS 1941.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 20th day of
August, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Medical Practitioners Emergency Regulations 1941.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914,* or any other Act, the Director-General of Health shall, if so directed by the Medical Council, issue to any medical student, but subject to the succeeding provisions of these regulations, a provisional certificate which shall entitle the holder to practise as a medical practitioner within the meaning of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914.

3. The direction of the Medical Council shall be given by resolution passed in that behalf and shall not be given in respect of any person unless the Council is satisfied that such person has entered for the medical curriculum of the University of New Zealand with a view to becoming a graduate in medicine and surgery of the University and has completed all parts of the curriculum up to and including the passing of all necessary examinations pertaining to the first five years of the course in medicine and is continuing to fulfil the requirements of the University in respect of the sixth year of that course.

4. No such resolution shall be passed unless there are produced to the Council a certificate from the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine in the University of Otago to the effect that the student in question is in the opinion of the Dean a fit and proper person to receive a provisional certificate under these regulations and a certificate from the Director-General of Health to the effect that in his opinion the issue of the certificate is desirable in the public interest.

5. The issue of a provisional certificate under these regulations shall be conclusive proof that the requirements of the two last preceding regulations have been complied with.

6. The provisions of subsections (2), (3), and (4) of section 32 of the Medical Practitioners Act, 1914, shall apply to certificates issued under these regulations and to the holders thereof.
