PURSUANT to section 39 of the Medical Practitioners Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by the Minister with the Medical Council of New Zealand, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. New First Schedule substituted in principal regulations—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made pursuant to section 39 of the Medical Practitioners Act 1968, and amend the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement.
Regulation 2 substitutes a revised Schedule of registrable medical specialists.
Regulation 3 increases from \$25 to \$50 the fee payable on first registration under the principal regulations.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 2 April 1980. These regulations are administered in the Department of Health.
