ORDER IN COUNCIL

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 39 of the Medical Practitioners Act 1968, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by the Minister with the Medical Council of New Zealand, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Amendments to First Schedule to principal regulations—

(1) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 (1) of the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971, Amendment No. 5) is hereby amended by inserting in the third and fourth columns of the item relating to Anaesthetics, immediately after item (a) in those columns, the following particulars:

“(aa) Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists Fellowship.”

(2) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby amended by omitting the item relating to Community Medicine.

(3) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby amended by inserting, after the item relating to Diagnostic Radiology, the following item:

“Emergency Medicine .. Australasian College for Emergency Medicine Fellowship.”

(4) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby amended by omitting the item relating to Internal Medicine, and substituting the following item:

(5) The First Schedule to the principal regulations (as so substituted) is hereby amended by inserting, after the item relating to Psychological Medicine or Psychiatry, the following item:

The Royal Australasian
College of Physicians
(b) New Zealand College of (a) Fellowship
Community Medicine (b) Membership."

3. Transitional provision—(1) Every medical practitioner who, immediately before the commencement of these regulations, is registered as a specialist in the specialty of Community Medicine shall, on the commencement of these regulations, be deemed to be registered as a specialist in the specialty of Public Health Medicine.

(2) The Secretary to the Council shall, as soon as practicable after the commencement of these regulations, and without further authority than this regulation, do everything necessary to give effect to subclause (1) of this regulation.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Medical Practitioners (Registration of Specialists) Regulations 1971.

The regulations make various amendments to the First Schedule to the principal regulations, which lists the specialties in which medical practitioners may be registered, and the training and qualifications required for such registration.

The amendments are as follows:

- (a) The qualification of Fellowship of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists is added to the specialty of Anaesthetics:
- (b) A new specialty of Emergency Medicine is added:
- (c) The specialty of Community Medicine is replaced by the specialty of Public Health Medicine. Medical practitioners who are already registered in the specialty of Community Medicine are deemed to hold registration in the specialty of Public Health Medicine:
- (d) The sub-specialties of Occupational Medicine and Rehabilitation Medicine are added to the specialty of Internal Medicine, and new qualifications relating to those sub-specialties are inserted.
