PURSUANT to section 15 of the Medical Practitioners Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Overseas Qualifications) Order 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Overseas qualifications for conditional registration—The Third Schedule to the Medical Practitioners Act 1968 (as added by section 5 (3) (b) of the Medical Practitioners Amendment Act 1970) is hereby amended by omitting the heading “CEYLON” and the item—

and substituting the heading “SRI LANKA” and the item—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

At present the qualification of Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery of the University of Sri Lanka (formerly known as the University of Ceylon) is recognised in this country for the purpose of conditional registration under the Medical Practitioners Act 1968.

The effect of the order is to restrict recognition to cases where that qualification has been acquired before 1 January 1973.
