ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of October 1976

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Medical Practitioners Act 1968, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Fees) Regulations 1974, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Medical Practitioners (Fees) Regulations 1974* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1977.
- 2. Fees—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by:
 - (a) Omitting from the item relating to the fee payable on an application for a certificate of probationary registration the expression "20.00", and substituting the expression "35.00":
 - (b) Omitting from the item relating to the fee payable for a certificate of probationary registration the expression "2.00", and substituting the expression "35.00":
 - (c) Omitting from the item relating to the fee payable on an application for registration by the holder of a certificate of probationary registration the expression "10.00", and substituting the expression "30.00".

3. Transitional—Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of these regulations, the fee payable for a certificate of probationary registration issued after the commencement of these regulations in respect of an application received by the Secretary to the Council before that commencement shall be \$2.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the fees payable with respect to probationary registration and registration of persons holding probationary registration.
