## THE MINING REGULATIONS 1926, AMENDMENT NO. 12

At the Government House at Wellington, this 19th day of September 1951

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Mining Act 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 12, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations under the Mining Act 1926, made on the 9th day of November 1926\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Regulation 124 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 15 of the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 10, is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclause:—
- "(3) The fee payable for examination by every candidate for a mine manager's certificate shall be £3 3s. in the case of a first class certificate and £2 5s. in the case of a second class certificate:
- "Provided that in any case where the Board grants a candidate a partial pass and requires him to be re-examined in the written portion of any subject, the fee payable for the re-examination shall be 12s. 6d. per subject."

3. Regulation 125 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 15 of the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 10, is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the following subclause:—

"(3) The fee payable for examination by every candidate for a

battery superintendent's certificate shall be £3 3s.:

"Provided that in any case where the Board grants a candidate a partial pass and requires him to be re-examined in the written portion of any subject, the fee payable for the re-examination shall be 12s. 6d. per subject."

4. Regulation 126 of the principal regulations, as substituted by regulation 15 of the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 10, is hereby amended by revoking subclause (3), and substituting the

following subclause:-

"(3) The fee payable for examination by every candidate for a dredgemaster's certificate shall be £3 3s."

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations increase the fees payable in respect of examinations under the Mining Act 1926. There has been no alteration in the scale of fees since 1926.
