



THE MINING REGULATIONS 1926, AMENDMENT NO. 17

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 19th day of July 1967

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Mining Act 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 17, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations under the Mining Act 1926, made on the 9th day of November 1926* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 15 (as substituted by regulation 4 of the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 8) and substituting the following regulation:

“15. **Rent under mineral prospecting warrants**—The rent payable under a mineral prospecting warrant granted on or after the 10th day of July 1967 shall be 1 cent an acre per annum for the first two years, 2 cents an acre per annum for the third and fourth years, and 5 cents an acre for the fifth year.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 84 (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Mining Regulations 1926, Amendment No. 10) and substituting the following regulation:

“84. Upon payment of a fee of 7 cents per folio of seventy-two words or any part thereof, the Registrar shall furnish to any person applying for the same a certified copy of any registered instrument; and every document purporting to be certified under the hand of the Registrar and the seal of the Court as a certified copy of a registered instrument shall, without proof of his signature, be received in evidence for all purposes for which the original instrument might be put in evidence.”

4. The Sixth Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting Item 24 of Part III, and substituting the following item:

“24. For copy of any proceedings: for each complete folio of 72 \$
words or part thereof 0.07”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make the appropriate amendments to the principal regulations so as to provide for the conversion to decimal currency where the conversion is not exact.
