



## THE MEAT REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 17

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 22nd day of September  
1965

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Meat Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Meat Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 17, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1965.

2. (1) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking clause 12:4 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Meat Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 16)†, and substituting the following clause:

“12:4. In addition to the foregoing fees there shall be payable in respect of stock slaughtered in an abattoir or meat-export slaughterhouse the following inspection fees:

For every head of—

(2) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clauses 12:5 and 12:6.

(3) Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clause 12:7, and substituting the following clause:

“12:7 (1) The manager of every abattoir and the licensee of every meat-export slaughterhouse shall daily forward to the Inspector on a form provided for the purpose by the Director-General of Agriculture

a return of the number and description of all stock slaughtered at that abattoir or meat-export slaughterhouse during the previous working day.

“(2) The manager of every abattoir and the licensee of every meat-export slaughterhouse shall elect whether the inspection fees payable in terms of clause 12:4 of this regulation shall be payable by four-weekly payments or by calendar monthly payments and shall notify the Director-General of Agriculture in writing of any such election.

“(3) Any election made in terms of paragraph (2) of this clause shall remain in force until amended by notice in writing to be given not later than the 1st day of September in any year to the Director-General of Agriculture. Any such notice will take effect from the 1st day of October immediately following the giving of such notice.

“(4) The Director-General of Agriculture shall notify in writing the manager of every abattoir and the licensee of every meat-export slaughterhouse of the amount of fees due in terms of clause 12:4 of this regulation in respect of each four-weekly period or calendar month, as the case may be, and the manager of every abattoir and the licensee of every meat-export slaughterhouse shall within 15 days of the receipt of any such notice in writing remit to the Director-General of Agriculture the amount of fees due as specified in the notice to such office of the Department of Agriculture as the Director-General of Agriculture shall specify in the notice.

“Provided that the Director-General of Agriculture may extend the date of payment of fees as he in his discretion shall think fit.”

3. Regulation 12 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking clause 12:8, and substituting the following clause:

“12:8 (1) Subject to the provisions of subclause (2) of this clause there shall be payable in respect of stock slaughtered in any rural slaughterhouse the following inspection fees:

“Where the number of stock slaughtered in any one period of three calendar months ending with the last days of September, December, March, and June:

(2) The appropriate fee prescribed by subclause (1) of this clause shall be increased by 1s. and 9d. for every pig slaughtered during any such period.

(3) For the purposes of this clause, every head of cattle other than calves, shall be reckoned as five head of stock.”

4. The Meat Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 16, are hereby revoked.
