THE MARRIAGE REGULATIONS 1956, AMENDMENT NO. 1

COBHAM, Governor-General
ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 13th day of September 1961

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Marriage Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Marriage Regulations 1956, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Marriage Regulations 1956* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1961.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclauses (3) and (4), and substituting the following subclauses:

“(3) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage in the Registrar-General’s Office shall be in either form 11 or form 12 in the First Schedule hereto.

“(4) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage in the register book in the lawful custody of a Registrar shall be in either form 11A or form 12A in the First Schedule hereto.

“(5) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage shall include the particulars set out in the form used for the purpose of the copy so far as they are registered.

“(6) A certified copy of an entry of marriage in form 11 or form 11A as the case may be shall be issued and shall be used in every case except where particulars of the parents of either of the parties to the marriage are material for the purpose for which the certified copy is required. Where those particulars are so material a certified copy in form 12 or form 12A as the case may be shall be issued.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 3, the following regulation:

“3A. There shall be paid to every New Zealand representative who gives a certificate under section 43 of the Act a fee of £2 5s. for each such certificate.”

4. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the forms numbered 11 and 12, and substituting the forms numbered 11, 11A, 12, and 12A set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 1961, prescribe shorter forms of marriage certificates. These shorter forms are to be used in every case except where the information omitted is material for the purpose for which the certificate is required.

The regulations also prescribe a fee of £2 5s. for each certificate given by a New Zealand representative under section 43 of the Act. This certificate is used when a New Zealand representative has attended the marriage of a New Zealand citizen in a country other than New Zealand and is satisfied that the marriage has been solemnised in accordance with the formalities of the law of that other country.
