ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 15th day of October 1973

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Meat Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Meat Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat Regulations 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1973.

2. Abattoir, export slaughterhouse, and rural slaughterhouse fees—The Sixth Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from clause 8 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Meat Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 3) the item relating to pigs, and substituting the following item:

“Pigs 0.89”:

(b) By omitting from clause 9 (b) (as substituted by the same regulation) the expression “0.40”, and substituting the expression “0.45”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase from \$0.885 to \$0.89 a head the meat inspection levy payable in respect of pigs killed in abattoirs and export slaughterhouses. The surcharge in respect of pigs killed in rural slaughterhouses is increased from \$0.40 to \$0.45 a head.

The increased levies take effect from 1 November 1973.
