



**THE MEAT (PAYMENTS) REGULATIONS 1990,
AMENDMENT NO. 3**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 31st day of August 1992

PURSUANT to the Meat Act 1981, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Meat (Payments) Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Meat (Payments) Regulations 1990* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1992.

2. Returns—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 6, and substituting the following regulation:

“6. (1) In this regulation,—

“‘Return period’ means a period that is—

“(a) A week commencing and ending in the same calendar month; or

“(b) A continuous period of less than 7 days—

“(i) Commencing at noon on the last Sunday in any calendar month and ending with the close of the last day of that month; or

“(ii) Commencing at the close of the last day of any calendar month and ending at noon on the first Sunday of the next month:

“‘Week’ means a period commencing at noon on a Sunday and ending at noon on the next Sunday.

“(2) Every manager of an abattoir or an export slaughterhouse shall, within 10 days of the end of every week,—

“(a) Complete and forward to the Director-General, on a form provided by the Director-General, a return, in relation to—

“(i) The week (where it is itself a return period); or

“(ii) Every return period during the week (where the week is not itself a return period),—
in respect of stock slaughtered in the abattoir or slaughterhouse; and

“(b) Give a copy of the return to the Inspector in charge of the abattoir or slaughterhouse.

“(3) Every manager of any custom killing premises or a rural slaughterhouse shall, within 10 days of the end of every quarter (ending with the last day of March, June, September, or December),—

“(a) Complete and forward to the Director-General, on a form provided by the Director-General, a return in respect of stock slaughtered in the premises or slaughterhouse during the quarter; and

“(b) Give a copy of the return to the Inspector in charge of the premises or slaughterhouse.”

3. Payment of levies—Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the expression “30”, and substituting the expression “15”.

4. New schedules substituted—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First and Second Schedules (as substituted by regulation 4 (1) of the Meat (Payments) Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the schedules set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 4 of the Meat (Payments) Regulations 1990, Amendment No. 2, is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 1992, have 3 effects. First, they align the making of returns and payment of levies under the Meat (Payments) Regulations 1990 more closely with the making of returns and payment of levies under the Meat Export Control Act 1921-22. Secondly, they specify the periods in respect of which returns are to be made. Thirdly, they increase the amounts of certain levies.

Returns for abattoirs and export slaughterhouses will continue to be made weekly, but within 10 consecutive days of the end of the week rather than 10 working days. Returns for custom killing premises and rural slaughterhouses will now be made within 10 consecutive days of the end of every quarter, rather than 10 working days of the end of every week. Levies will be payable within 15 (rather than 30) days of receiving notice to pay them.

The levy per head of cattle (other than cows and calves) is increased from \$6.7669 to \$7.2244; and the levy per cow is increased from \$7.1803 to \$7.6378.
