## THE MEAT RATIONING PERMIT 1944

Pursuant to the Rationing Emergency Regulations 1942,\* the Rationing Controller hereby grants the following permit:—

- 1. This permit may be cited as the Meat Rationing Permit 1944, and shall come into force on the 6th day of March, 1944.
  - 2. In this permit,—
    - "Coupon-free meat" means canned meat; minced meat, sausages, sausage-meat; bacon, ham; tripe, liver, kidney, heart, tongue, brains, sweetbreads, ox-tail, ox-heel, ox-cheek, cow-heel, calf's head, calf's feet, sheep's head, sheep's trotters, pig's head, pig's trotters, pig's hocks; thin flanks, ox-skirts, mutton skirts, mutton flaps, trimmings, shin meat, pork fillets, bones (without meat); dripping, suet, small-goods; poultry, rabbits, fish, game:

"The regulations" means the Rationing Emergency Regulations

1942.\*

- **3.** Any trader may supply coupon-free meat to any consumer without the surrender or cancellation of any coupons and notwithstanding that the trader may not be licensed under the regulations.
- 4. Except as may be from time to time provided by any directions of the Rationing Controller under the regulations, any person may supply coupon-free meat to any other person who is not a consumer whether or not the person supplying the meat or the person to whom it is supplied is a trader.
- 5. Nothing in this permit shall excuse any person from compliance with any directions of the Rationing Controller under the regulations, or from compliance with any restrictions or obligations imposed by or under any Act, or by or under any other regulations.
