REGULATIONS 1999**

PURSUANT to section 40 of the Medical Auxiliaries Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

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REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Radiation Technologists Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Medical Radiation Technologists Regulations 1995* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 1 April 1999.

2. Third Schedule amended—(1) The Third Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by omitting item 1, and substituting the following items:

Amendment No. 1: S.R. 1996/188
Amendment No. 2: S.R. 1998/353

- “1. Registration on the basis of a qualification in the First Schedule obtained, or otherwise qualified for, in New Zealand or Australia 280
- “1A. Registration on any other basis 380”.

(2) The Third Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by omitting from item 3 the expression “112”, and substituting the expression “155”.

(3) The Third Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by adding the following item:

- “9. Examination set or approved by the Board 1,100”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 April 1999, amend the fees paid by medical radiation technologists. They—

- increase the fee paid by applicants for registration who have New Zealand or Australian qualifications. This fee is also the fee payable by applicants seeking registration under the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition Act 1997
- add a new fee for applicants for registration who have other qualifications
- increase the annual licence fee
- add a new fee for sitting an examination set or approved by the Medical Radiation Technologists Board.
