REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Medical Radiation Technologists Amendment Regulations (No. 2) 1999, and are part of the Medical Radiation Technologists Regulations 1995* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 16 August 1999.

2. First Schedule amended—The First Schedule of the principal regulations is amended by adding the following item:

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 16 August 1999, amend the First Schedule of the Medical Radiation Technologists Regulations 1995 to recognise a new degree (Bachelor of Medical Imaging issued by the Christchurch Polytechnic), the completion of which would provide qualifications acceptable for registration as a medical radiation technologist.
