ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of December 1970

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Motor Spirits Distribution Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Motor Spirits Distribution Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Motor Spirits Distribution Regulations 1955* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1971.
- 2. Wholesaler's annual licence fee—(1) Regulation 10 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 of the Motor Spirits Distribution Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 2) is hereby further amended by omitting the expression "\$6", and substituting the expression "\$72".
- (2) Regulation 2 of the Motor Spirits Distribution Regulations 1955, Amendment No. 2, is hereby revoked.
- 3. Application fee for retailer's licence—Regulation 15 of the principal regulations (as amended by section 7 (1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1964) is hereby further amended by omitting the expression "\$4", and substituting the expression "\$10".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations increase the annual fee for a wholesaler's licence from \$6 to \$72, and increase the fee for an application for a retailer's licence, and for a transfer or variation of a retailer's licence, from \$4 to \$10.
