**THE MAORI SCHOOLS REGULATIONS 1959, AMENDMENT
NO. 3**

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Maori Schools Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Maori Schools Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Tenure of scholarship—Regulation 26 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following additional proviso:

“Provided also that the Director-General may, in any year of the tenure of a scholarship, terminate the scholarship from the end of that school year, if he is satisfied that the holder can be reasonably expected to attend, without living away from home, a secondary school at which he or she is qualified, under subsection (1) of section 85 of the Education Act 1964, to receive free education and which provides a course of instruction appropriate to his or her needs.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations authorise the Director-General to terminate a post-primary scholarship from the end of any school year during its tenure if he is satisfied that the holder can, without living away from home, attend a secondary school that provides an appropriate course.
