PURSUANT to section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932 (as amended by section 4 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1951), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Motor Spirits Surtax Order 1952.
2. The 4th day of December 1951 is hereby appointed as the date after which all goods imported into New Zealand or entered therein for home consumption, being goods referred to in the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 6 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1932, became subject to that proviso.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

This order appoints 4 December 1951 as the date of the cancellation of the exemption from surtax on motor spirits from the United Kingdom and certain other parts of the British dominions. The effect is that all motor spirits imported or entered for home consumption after that date are liable for surtax.
