# THE MAORI TRUST OFFICE REGULATIONS 1954, AMENDMENT NO. 9

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 25th day of October 1983

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. D. MACINTYRE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 26 of the Maori Trustee Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Maori Trust Office Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Maori Trust Office Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of November 1983.
- 2. Interest on Sinking Fund Accounts reduced—(1) Regulation 8 (2) of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 2 (1) of the Maori Trust Office Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 8) is hereby amended by omitting the item relating to Sinking Fund Accounts, and substituting the following item:

"Sinking Fund Accounts: 8 percent."

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations reduce from 11 percent to 8 percent the rate of interest payable by the Maori Trustee on Sinking Fund Accounts within the Common Fund.
