THE MAORI TRUSTEE REGULATIONS 1922, AMENDMENT NO. 5

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Maori Trustee Act, 1930, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Maori Trustee Regulations 1922, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the regulations (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) made on the 30th day of October, 1922, pursuant to the Maori Trustee Act, 1920, the Maori Reserves Act, 1882, the Westland and Nelson Maori Reserves Act, 1887, and the West Coast Settlement Reserves Act, 1892.
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day following the date of their notification in the Gazette.
- 2. Subclause (1) of Regulation 10 of the principal regulations, as substituted by Regulation 4 of the Maori Trustee Regulations 1922, Amendment No. 4, is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (i), and substituting the following subparagraph:—
 - "(i) If held at call, 1 per cent.:".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations reduce the rate of interest payable by the Maori Trustee on funds held at call in the Maori Trustee's Common Fund from 2 per cent. to 1 per cent. per annum.
