## THE MOTOR VEHICLES INSURANCE (THIRD PARTY RISKS) REGULATIONS 1950, AMENDMENT NO. 2

# FREYBERG, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 14th day of May 1952

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Transport Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Regulations 1950\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1952.

2. (1) Regulation 6 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 1) is hereby further amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words "1st day of July, 1951", and substituting the words "1st day of July, 1952".

(2) Regulation 3 of the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party

Risks) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 1, is hereby revoked.

3. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Regulations 1950, Amendment No. 1), and substituting the following Schedule:—
