THE MINIMUM WAGE ORDER 1954

Pursuant to the Minimum Wage Act 1945, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. This order may be cited as the Minimum Wage Order 1954.
- 2. For male workers, the minimum rates of wages for the purposes of section 2 of the Minimum Wage Act 1945 shall be the following:
 - (a) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 4s. $7\frac{1}{2}$ d. an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:
 - (b) If paid by the day, £1 17s. a day:
 - (c) In all other cases, £9 a week.
- 3. For female workers, the minimum rates of wages for the purposes of section 2 of the Minimum Wage Act 1945 shall be the following:
 - (a) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 3s. 1d. an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:
 - (b) If paid by the day, £1 4s. 8d. a day:
 - (c) In all other cases, £6 a week.
 - 4. The Minimum Wage Order 1953* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.]

By this order the minimum rates of wages for adult workers are increased in the case of male workers by 1½d. an hour, 1s. a day, and 5s. a week, and in the case of female workers by 1d. an hour, 8d. a day, and 3s. 8d. a week.
