

THE MINIMUM WAGE ORDER 1967

Pursuant to the Minimum Wage Act 1945, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Minimum Wage Order 1967.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. For male workers, the minimum rate of wages for the purposes of section 2 of the Minimum Wage Act 1945 shall,—
 - (a) Until the commencement of Part II of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, be the following:
 - (i) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 5s. 8½d. an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:
 - (ii) If paid by the day, £2 5s. 6d. a day:
 - (iii) In all other cases, £11 2s. 6d. a week:
 - (b) After the commencement of Part II of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, be the following:
 - (i) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 57c an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:
 - (ii) If paid by the day, \$4.55 a day: (iii) In all other cases, \$22.25 a week.
- 3. For female workers, the minimum rate of wages for the purposes of section 2 of the Minimum Wage Act 1945 shall,—
 - (a) Until the commencement of Part II of the Decimal Currency Act 1964, be the following:
 - (i) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 3s. 9\(^3_4\)d. an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:
 - (ii) If paid by the day, £1 10s. 6d. a day:
 - (iii) In all other cases, £7 8s. 10d. a week:

(b) After the commencement of Part II of the Decimal Currency Act

1964, be the following:

(i) If paid by the hour or by piecework, 39c an hour or an amount equivalent thereto having regard to the rate of production of the worker:

(ii) If paid by the day, \$3.05 a day:

(iii) In all other cases, \$14.89 a week.

4. The Minimum Wage Order 1964* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. This order prescribes the minimum rates of wages for adult workers.
