THE NAVAL APPOINTMENTS EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1941.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of January, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Naval Appointments Emergency Regulations 1941.

- 2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 - "Naval Board" means the Naval Board of New Zealand established by the Naval Defence Amendment Act, 1936:
 - "Naval Secretary" means the officer designated in subsection (1) of section 3 of the Naval Defence Amendment Act, 1936.

3. The Governor-General may appoint and promote officers of the Naval Forces, and issue commissions or warrants to them, pursuant to paragraph (a) of section 4 of the Naval Defence Act, 1913, notwithstanding the provisions of section 5 of the said Act.

4. Such appointments and promotions shall be deemed to be temporary and may be terminated at the pleasure of the Governor-General, notwithstanding the provisions of section 6 of the said Act.

5. Persons may be provisionally appointed or promoted as officers of the Naval Forces and may be appointed from one ship to another by order of the Naval Board issued under the hand of the Naval Secretary, but such provisional appointments or promotions shall cease to have effect if not confirmed by the Governor-General under Regulation 3 hereof within three months from the date of provisional appointment or promotion.
