## REGULATIONS

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Nurses Amendment Regulations 1999, and are part of the Nurses Regulations 1986\* (“the principal regulations”).

(2) These regulations come into force on 7 October 1999.

**2. New schedules substituted**—The principal regulations are amended by revoking the First, Second, and Eighth Schedules, and substituting the First, Second, and Eighth Schedules set out in the Schedule of these regulations.

**3. Revocations**—Regulation 3 and the Schedule of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 5 are consequentially revoked.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 7 October 1999, amend the Nurses Regulations 1986—

- (a) By updating, in the First, Second, and Eighth Schedules (which list institutions at which certain nursing courses and midwifery courses are conducted), references to the following institutions:
- (i) Hawke's Bay Polytechnic (now known as the Eastern Institute of Technology);
  - (ii) Unitec (now known as Unitec: Institute of Technology);
  - (iii) Waiariki Polytechnic (now known as Waiariki Institute of Technology);
  - (iv) Wellington Polytechnic (now known as Massey University); and
- (b) By inserting in the First and Eighth Schedules references to the University of Auckland.
