Pursuant to section 60 of the Nurses Act 1977, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, and acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by that Minister with the Nursing Council of New Zealand, makes the following regulations.

Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Nurses Amendment Regulations 2001.
- (2) In these regulations, the Nurses Regulations 1986¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Schedules amended

The principal regulations are amended by—

- (a) omitting from the First, Second, and Eighth Schedules the item “Waikato Polytechnic”, and substituting in each case the item “Waikato Institute of Technology”; and
- (b) omitting from the First, Second, and Eighth Schedules the item “Christchurch Polytechnic”, and substituting in each case the item “Christchurch Polytechnic Institute of Technology”.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the Nurses Regulations 1986 to reflect the change in name of 2 of the specified educational institutions. The institution previously called Waikato Polytechnic is now Waikato Institute of Technology and the institution previously called Christchurch Polytechnic is now Christchurch Polytechnic Institute of Technology.
