**THE NAVAL DOCKYARD EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1940,  
AMENDMENT NO. 1.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 23rd day of July, 1941.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Naval Dockyard Emergency Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and deemed part of the Naval Dockyard Emergency Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. The principal regulations are amended by inserting, after Regulation 16, the following regulations :—

“ 16A. Any officer of police may arrest without warrant any person guilty of a breach of these regulations or any person whom he reasonably believes to be so guilty, or whom he reasonably believes to be without lawful justification or excuse within the premises of the Naval Dockyard, the Naval Armament Depot, or any area for the time being declared under Regulation 12 to be a prohibited area, or whom he has reasonable grounds to suspect of being engaged or about to engage in any act calculated to be harmful to the said Naval Dockyard or Naval Armament Depot or any Government property therein.

“ 16B. Any officer of police may carry out an order of the Captain in charge relating to the removal of any person, the apprehension or detention of any person, or the search of any person, vehicle, receptacle, or parcel.

“ 16c. The powers conferred on officers of police by these regulations shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the powers conferred on officers of police by any statute.”
