HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Orchard and Garden Diseases Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 3.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the New-Zealand-grown Fruit Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.

4. Clause 3 : 2 of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the figures " 3 : 7 ", and substituting the figures " 3 : 8 ".

5. Clause 3 : 7 of Regulation 3 is revoked, and the following clause substituted :—

" 3 : 7. If the Director is satisfied that any person, on the coming into force of any regulations varying the specification of standard packages for fruit set forth in the First Schedule hereto, has on hand any packages of a type prescribed by these regulations as immediately theretofore in force or stocks of timber specially sawn or prepared for making such packages, he may authorize such person to use packages of such type in lieu of packages of the type newly prescribed as aforesaid for such period as he may specify in his authorization, but no such authorization shall authorize the use of such first-mentioned packages for a period exceeding six months from the date on which the application was made for authority to use such packages."

All packages, with the exception of No. 5, shall be constructed in such a manner that the opening for the purpose of packing fruit therein shall be only on its greatest width.
