Pursuant to the Niue Act 1966, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Niue Land Registration Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Niue Land Registration Regulations 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Procedure for registration of instruments—Regulation 15 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b) of subclause (2), and substituting the following paragraph:
 - "(b) The name of each person taking any benefit under the instrument; and."
- 3. Validation of certain memorials—Every memorial entered in the register before the making of these regulations which would have been valid if these regulations had been in force when the memorial was entered is hereby declared to have been validly entered, and the instrument to which it relates is hereby declared to have been duly registered.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide that a memorial of registration of any instrument entered in the register is to state the name of the party taking any benefit under the instrument, instead of stating the names of all the parties to the instrument.
