

THE NARCOTICS ORDER 1969

Pursuant to the Narcotics Act 1965, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Narcotics Order 1969.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the fourth day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
- 2. First Schedule to Act amended—The First Schedule to the Narcotics Act 1965 is hereby amended by inserting in clause 1, in its appropriate alphabetical order, the following name of a substance:
 - "BEZITRAMIDE (1-(3-cyano-3, 3-diphenylpropyl)-4-(2-oxo-3-propionyl-1-benzimidazolinyl)-piperidine)."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order amends the Narcotics Act 1965 by making bezitramide a narcotic within the meaning of that Act.
