PURSUANT to the Nurses Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1973, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Nurses Regulations 1973* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of March 1977.

2. Certain fees increased—Regulation 23 of the principal regulations is hereby amended—

- (a) By omitting from subclause (1) the expression “\$12”, and substituting the expression “\$15”;
- (b) By omitting from subclause (3) the expression “\$36”, and substituting the expression “\$45”;
- (c) By omitting from the said subclause (3) the expression “\$12”, and substituting the expression “\$15”;
- (d) By omitting from subclause (6) the expression “\$2”, and substituting the expression “\$5”;
- (e) By omitting from subclause (7) the expression “\$2”, and substituting the expression “\$5”;
- (f) By omitting from subclause (8) the expression “\$4”, and substituting the expression “\$8”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Regulation 1 relates to the Title and commencement. The regulations come into force on 1 March 1977.

Regulation 2 increases some of the fees prescribed by regulation 23 of the principal regulations as follows:

- (a) Examination fee for each paper, from \$12 to \$15:
- (b) Registration fee payable by persons possessing some qualification other than one resulting from passing the prescribed examinations, from \$36 to \$45 for the first registration, and from \$12 to \$15 for each additional or subsequent registration:
- (c) Fee for noting qualification in the register pursuant to section 24 of the Act, from \$2 to \$5:
- (d) Fee for restoration of a name to the register, from \$2 to \$5:
- (e) Fee for annual practising certificate, from \$4 to \$8.
