ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 60 (1) of the Nurses Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by that Minister with the Nursing Council of New Zealand, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Nurses Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Initial fee for registration or enrolment increased—Regulation 27 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1) is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (3) the expression “\$50”, and substituting the expression “\$85”.

3. Amount of goods and services tax not included—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 27 (as so substituted), the following regulation:

“27A. The fees prescribed by these regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.”

4. Revocation—Regulation 3 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the Nurses Regulations 1986.

The regulations—

- (a) Increase from \$50 to \$85 the initial fee payable on an application under section 18 of the Nurses Act 1977 for registration or enrolment; and
- (b) Provide that the new fee and existing fees prescribed by the principal regulations are exclusive of goods and services tax.
