ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 26th day of November 1990

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to paragraphs (d) and (e) of section 60 (1) of the Nurses Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice of the Minister of Health given after consultation by that Minister with the Nursing Council of New Zealand, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Nurses Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) Except as provided in subclause (3) of this regulation, these regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1991.

(3) Subclauses (7) and (8) of regulation 27 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of these regulations) shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1991.

2. Fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 27 (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1 and amended by regulation 2 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the following regulation:

“27. (1) The fee payable by a nursing student on application to sit any State Examination shall be,—

“(a) In respect of a student seeking to sit an examination to qualify as a registered general and obstetric nurse or registered comprehensive nurse, \$68:

“(b) In respect of a student seeking to sit an examination to qualify as a midwife, psychiatric nurse, psychopaedic nurse, or enrolled nurse, \$22.

“(2) The fee payable by a nursing student on application under section 17 of the Act for registration or enrolment shall be \$30, which shall include the issue of a certificate of registration or enrolment.

“(3) The fee payable by a person on application under section 18 of the Act for registration or enrolment shall be \$96, and a further fee of \$30, which shall include the issue of a certificate of registration or enrolment, shall be payable if the registration or enrolment is granted.

“(4) The fee for temporary registration or enrolment under section 31 (2) of the Act shall be \$30.

“(5) The fee for an application for the restoration of a name to the register or roll following its removal under Part IV of the Act shall be \$169, irrespective of the number of parts of the register affected.

“(6) The fee for supplying any document for the purpose of enabling a nurse to seek registration or enrolment overseas shall be \$16.

“(7) The fee for an annual practising certificate issued under section 51 (4) of the Act shall be \$24.

“(8) The fee for an annual practising certificate issued under section 51 (9) of the Act shall be \$48.

“(9) The fee for inspection of the register or roll shall be \$13.”

3. Amount of goods and services tax included—Regulation 27A of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 3 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2) is hereby amended by omitting the word “exclusive”, and substituting the word “inclusive”.

4. Saving—Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 27 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of these regulations) or of regulation 27A of the principal regulations (as so inserted and as amended by regulation 3 of these regulations)—

(a) The fee payable for any practising certificate issued under section 51 (4) of the Act in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1991 shall be \$16 (which amount is exclusive of goods and services tax); and

(b) The fee payable for any practising certificate issued under section 51 (9) of the Act in respect of the year ending with the 31st day of March 1991 shall be \$32 (which amount is exclusive of goods and services tax).

5. Revocations—(1) The Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1 are hereby consequentially revoked.

(2) Regulation 2 of the Nurses Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 2 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1991, increase the fees payable for various matters under the Nurses Regulations 1986. The fees are inclusive of goods and services tax.

The fees payable for any annual practising certificate in respect of the current year (which ends on 31 March 1991) are not increased. The annual practising certificate fees are increased on and from 1 April 1991.
