PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Nelson Secondary Schools Regulations 1966, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Nelson Secondary Schools Regulations 1966* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1974.

2. Board of Governors of Buller High School—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 6, and substituting the following regulation:

“6. (1) The Board of Governors of Buller High School shall consist of—

“(a) One Governor appointed by the Nelson Education Board:

“(b) Six Governors elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, of whom at least 2 Governors shall be women:

“(c) One Governor elected by the members of the school committees of the Westport North State Primary School and the Westport South State Primary School:

- “(d) One Governor elected by the members of the school committees of the Waimangaroa State Primary School, the Granity State Primary School, and the Seddonville State Primary School:
“(e) Two Governors co-opted by the Board itself if and when it thinks fit.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Nelson Secondary Schools Regulations 1966. The regulations come into force on 1 June 1974. The constitution of the Board of Governors of the Buller High School will consist of 1 governor, instead of 3 governors, to be appointed by the Nelson Education Board; 6, instead of 3, governors to be elected by the parents of pupils attending the school; and instead of 6 governors elected variously by associations of employers, associations of employees, and borough and county councils, 2 governors will be elected by the members of certain school committees. Two more governors may be co-opted by the Board itself if and when it thinks fit.
