



**THE TARANAKI, WELLINGTON, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO  
AND SOUTHLAND TINSMITHING, COPPERSMITHING, AND  
SHEET-METAL WORKING (DAIRYING INDUSTRY) LABOUR  
LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1940.**

WHEREAS it appears to me to be expedient for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,\* do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Taranaki, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Tinsmithing, Coppersmithing, and Sheet-metal Working (Dairying Industry) Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1940.

2. This Order applies to all workers employed by persons, firms, and companies in the Taranaki, Wellington, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Industrial Districts and engaged wholly or substantially in the manufacture and/or repair of one or more of the following lines: Milk-cans, cream-cans, milk-coolers, cream-coolers, direct-expansion vats, cheese-vats, cheese-hoops, milking-machine releasers, teat-cups, cream-receiving vats, deodorizers, refrigerator coils, and refrigerator cabinets.

3. The provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder, and all awards and industrial agreements under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all other voluntary agreements affecting conditions of employment, shall be and are hereby suspended in so far as any such provisions operate to prevent or restrict the employment of the workers referred to in clause 2 hereof during the months of June to November inclusive in each year on the terms and conditions set out in clause 14 of the Northern Industrial District Tinsmiths, Coppersmiths, and Sheet-metal Workers' award, dated the 4th day of August, 1939, and recorded in Book of Awards, Vol. XXXIX, p. 1151.

4. This Order shall come into effect on and from the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.
